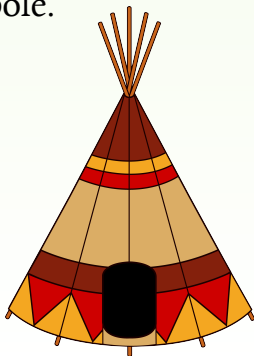


Camp Agawak for Girls; Minocqua, WI
